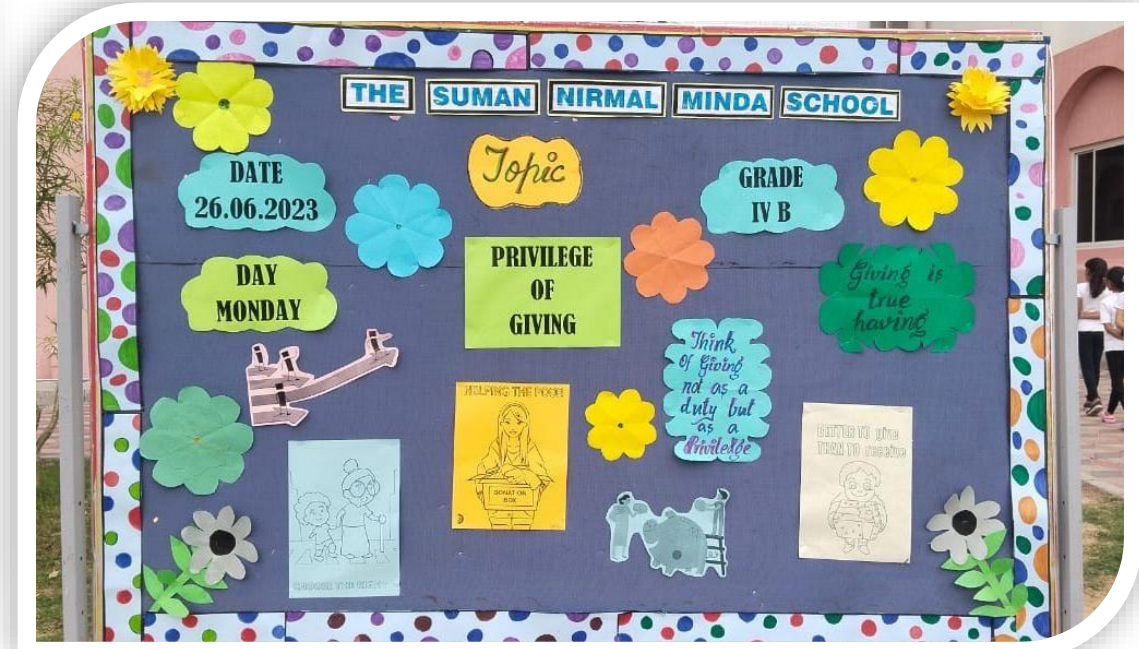
International Day against Drug Abuse

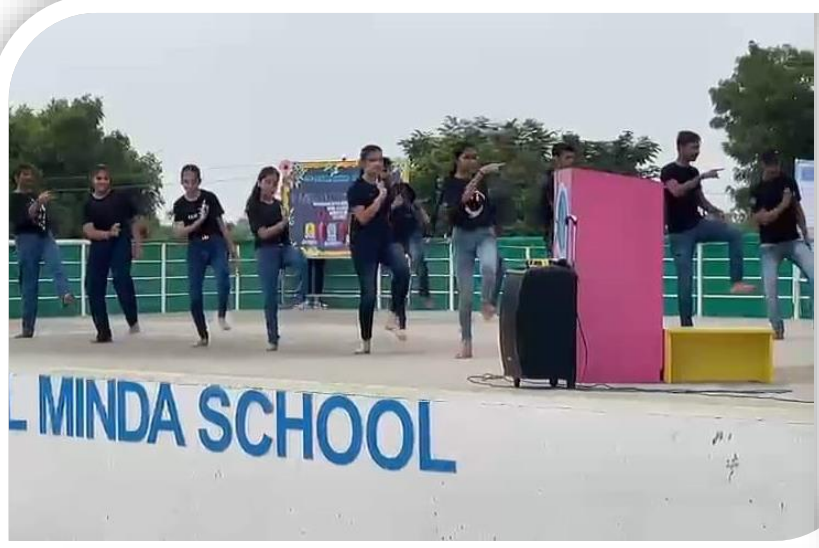


Investiture Ceremony
